GIVE US OUR BREAD, OUR DAILY BREAD...

We can't live off the food we ate last year or even last month. I need daily nutrition to stay healthy. The early folks in AA used this comparison in describing our spiritual lives. We don't do well trying to live off a Spiritual Experience we had in the PAST. We need DAILY contact with God to stay sober and comfortable in our own skins. Daily.

I talk to people every day that are struggling with this. After a while, they begin to question if they ever REALLY had a Spiritual Experience to begin with. Sad. I have watched thousands of y'all have Spiritual Experiences sitting up on this hill. I mean amazing experiences. But you know the old saying...you grow or

you go.
Visiting with many of you that relapse, we have the same discussion.
You are trying to make sense of the

relapse by always connecting it to something external. Logical but wrong. A frustrating dead end. Disconnection from our Higher Power is the cause of the relapse. Reconnection is the solution. I know some of you are grinding your teeth right now. I'm not making light of your struggles or the drama...that stuff is real! The BB on p. 45 says it best. (we talk about it all the time) "Lack of Power that was our dilemma"....

When I work the steps I get the promised Spiritual Experience. That Experience gives me enough POWER to stay sober and take care of life's dramas with plenty left over. This needed power is what's missing in most of our lives. The desire to stay connected doesn't seem to be enough. It's important but some days, ya know, just aren't any fun! ACTION is the key. Always has been. Go to a meeting, work the steps, especially the 12th one! Folks, people who are sponsoring other

folks aren't the ones coming back to treatment.

After all these years, it still catches me off guard when one of my guys gets loaded. Same conversation always follows...."I thought my case was different". NONE OF US ARE DIFFERENT. When we take the action, we stay connected...and sober.

Reunion 36 is May 2,3,4 2008 Make those hotel reservations NOW. I hear the Inn is already full!? Feel free to bring anyone you want....they don't have to be an alumnus to be welcome. Come for all three days or just a few hours.....we want to see you! Don't forget to watch the weather. Sometimes it's still kind of chilly that time of year. Greetings to our Alumni and Their Families,

As I write this letter I am reflecting on as many of you as I can remember and wonder how you and the people that you care for and that care about you are doing.
